After completing *Farewell to Manzanar*, students should reread chapters 2-6 looking for examples of all aspects of life in the internment camp described by the author.

Next, go to the American Memory collection of photographs by Ansel Adams. <http://memory.loc.gov/ammem/aamhtml/aamhome.html> and http://lcweb.loc.gov/rr/print/coll/109_anse.html

Students write an essay using the information from the text and from viewing the photographs. In the essay, the student should show how bias and propaganda affected the way the American public thought about life in the internment camps.
